

# 10 THEMES FOR THE CHRISTIAN LIFE {Romans 5}

## 1. 2 Aspects Of Justification --

- A. By Faith. **Romans 5:1** Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ,
- B. By Blood. **Romans 5:9** Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from the wrath of God through Him.

## 2. 3 Aspects Of Boasting --

- A. In The Hope Of Glory. **Romans 5:2** through whom also we have obtained our introduction by faith into this grace in which we stand; and we exult in hope of the glory of God.
- B. In Tribulation. **Romans 5:3** And not only this, but we also exult in our tribulations, knowing that tribulation brings about perseverance;
- C. In God. **Romans 5:11** And not only this, but we also exult in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received the reconciliation.

## 3. 2 Views Of Salvation --

- A. From Wrath. **Romans 5:9** Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from the wrath of God through Him.
- B. In His Life. **Romans 5:10** For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life.

## 4. 4 Aspects Of Sin --

- A. A Falling Short. (Vss. 12-21)
- B. A Going Beyond. **Romans 5:14** Nevertheless death reigned from Adam until Moses, even over those who had not sinned in the likeness of the offense of Adam, who is a type of Him who was to come.
- C. A Falling Aside. **Romans 5:15-16** But the free gift is not like the transgression. For if by the transgression of the one the many died, much more did the grace of God and the gift by the grace of the one Man, Jesus Christ, abound to the many. (16) The gift is not like that which came through the one who sinned; for on the one hand the judgment arose from one transgression resulting in condemnation, but on the other hand the free gift arose from many transgressions resulting in justification.  
**Romans 5:18** So then as through one transgression there resulted condemnation to all men, even so through one act of righteousness there resulted justification of life to all men.  
**Romans 5:20** The Law came in so that the transgression would increase; but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more,
- D. A Positive Act. **Romans 5:19** For as through the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, even so through the obedience of the One the many will be made righteous.

## 5. 3 Results Of Sin --

- A. Judgment. **Romans 5:16** The gift is not like that which came through the one who sinned; for on the one hand the judgment arose from one transgression resulting in condemnation, but on the other hand the free gift arose from many transgressions resulting in justification.  
**Romans 5:18** So then as through one transgression there resulted condemnation to all men, even so through one act of righteousness there resulted justification of life to all men.

B. Condemnation. (Vss. 16-18)

C. Death. **Romans 5:12** Therefore, just as through one man sin entered into the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, because all sinned--

**Romans 5:15** But the free gift is not like the transgression. For if by the transgression of the one the many died, much more did the grace of God and the gift by the grace of the one Man, Jesus Christ, abound to the many.

## 6. 4 Aspects Of Redemption --

A. A Justifying Fact. **Romans 5:16** The gift is not like that which came through the one who sinned; for on the one hand the judgment arose from one transgression resulting in condemnation, but on the other hand the free gift arose from many transgressions resulting in justification.

**Romans 5:18** So then as through one transgression there resulted condemnation to all men, even so through one act of righteousness there resulted justification of life to all men.

B. A Justifying Result. **Romans 5:17** For if by the transgression of the one, death reigned through the one, much more those who receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ.

C. A Justifying Process. **Romans 5:18** So then as through one transgression there resulted condemnation to all men, even so through one act of righteousness there resulted justification of life to all men.

D. A Life Arising Out Of Justification (Vss. 18) **Romans 5:21** so that, as sin reigned in death, even so grace would reign through righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.
