

"The Thrill of Discipleship"

Luke 14:25-33

Lest anyone think that being a follower of Christ is cheap, Jesus makes it very plain that it is anything but cheap. The price, in fact, is more than many are ever willing to pay!

Jesus issues three (3) consecutive and progressive calls:

Come unto me. **Matthew 11:28** "Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest. (NASB)

Come after me. **Luke 14:27** "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after Me cannot be My disciple. (NASB)

Come with me. **1 Thessalonians 4:17** Then we who are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. (NASB)

I. Can one become a Christian without being a Disciple?

- A. Not according to the marching orders of our King. Matt. 28:19
- B. Disciples in the early church were called Christians. Act 11:25, 26; John 4:1

II. What are the earmarks of a Disciple of Christ?

- A. He is one who initiates and imitates his master. Matt. 10:24-25.
He is a witnessing learner. (*math é t és*)
- B. He is one who follows immediately. Mk. 1:16, 20

III. Beginning the sellout.

- A. A servant attitude must prevail. Mk. 10:45
- B. Priorities must be readjusted. Lk. 14:26
- C. Daily crosses must be carried. Lk. 14:27; 9:23
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"We seem to want to know the cost of everything but the price of nothing."
Matt. 13:44, 45.
- E. And finally we surrender, not re-dedicate or commit, but total victorious surrender. Lk. 14:31-33
- F. Our life is all that we really own. Matt. 16:25, 26

IV. Only now can a Disciple become a Discipler.

- A. Macedonians first gave themselves. II Cor. 8:5
